Expert Testimony: Judges, Science, and Trial by Jury

Saturday, July 15, 2023, Philadelphia, PA

Nearly 100 years ago, the "Frye" standard for expert opinion evidence was enunciated for the federal courts. Since then, American courts and legal scholars have struggled to achieve a treatment of expert testimony in litigation that is reasonable in an age of ever-developing scientific knowledge, allows litigants to make their cases using their own experts, and ensures experts meet a minimum qualification standard. The 1993 announcement of a new standard for federal courts (subsequently adopted by many state courts) in the Supreme Court's Daubert decision portended less rigid treatment of expert testimony, but its appointment of judges as "gatekeepers" to determine the admissibility of evidence has diminished the role of the jury and engendered satellite litigation, often at prohibitive expense.

Judges attending the 2023 Forum will consider (1) the evolution of our current patchwork of scientific evidence rules and practices and how they impact access to justice; and (2) the impact of the "gatekeeper" philosophy on litigants' rights to trial by jury.
