## ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE AND THE COURTS

Saturday, July 20, 2024, Nashville, Tennessee

Artificial Intelligence (the capability of machines to imitate intelligent human behavior, often called AI) surrounds us, but it is not always obvious. It has potential to assist in more efficient operation of the courts, enhance the rights of litigants and the public, and facilitate their use of the courts. However, the use of AI also can also have an impact on the reliability of information presented to courts, so judges need to be knowledgeable and prepared for the challenges it will bring.

Judges attending the Forum will consider how AI works in legal fields presently; evidentiary and ethical concerns of its use; what to expect for the near and far future; and how to protect litigants and judicial institutions from potential misuse of AI.
